ARE YOU A VISITOR at Christ Church today? WELCOME. PLEASE COME AGAIN. Please make yourself known to the ushers to get a free visitors bag. Please fill out the visitors card and put in the collection plate.

Nevada is one of those states that have seen a significant increase in reported COVID cases. We'd like to invite you to be as safe as possible while attending worship. We're depending on personal choice and are making no judgements regardless of your decisions.

On August 8th, we'll begin worshipping with Rite I at 7:45 a.m. It will be a quiet, spoken service with no music. At 9:45, we'll have a session for adults on spiritual journeys. Everyone present will have the opportunity to begin mapping their own journeys (Yes, we have all been on one!) as we prepare to study Marcus Borg's book, *Meeting Jesus for the First Time*.

In August, we'll have a Sunday event that will highlight the ministries of the parish, many of which have not seen the light of day since the COVID shutdown. At that time, you'll be able to see what each ministry and group does and you'll have the opportunity to indicate your interest. Post-COVID and during this interim time, we need to build the parish back up -- to reform it -- and we need everyone's involvement to do it.

In November, the Assisting Bishop will be making a visitation to CCE. At that time, he'll be doing confirmations, first communions, baptisms, reaffirmation of faith, and receptions. The date is November 14th at 4:00 p.m.

First Reading *Exodus 16:2-4,9-15* *Sitting*

The whole congregation of the Israelites complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness. The Israelites said to them, "If only we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the fleshpots and ate our fill of bread; for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger." Then the LORD said to Moses, "I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day. In that way I will test them, whether they will follow my instruction or not." Then Moses said to Aaron, "Say to the whole congregation of the Israelites, 'Draw near to the LORD, for he has heard your complaining.'" And as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the Israelites, they looked toward the wilderness, and the glory of the LORD appeared in the cloud. The LORD spoke to Moses and said, "I have heard the complaining of the Israelites; say to them, 'At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread; then you

shall know that I am the LORD your God.” In the evening quails came up and covered the camp; and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp. When the layer of dew lifted, there on the surface of the wilderness was a fine flaky substance, as fine as frost on the ground. When the Israelites saw it, they said to one another, “What is it?” For they did not know what it was. Moses said to them, “It is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat.”

I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore it is said, "When he ascended on high he made captivity itself a captive; he gave gifts to his people." (When it says, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.) The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming. But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.”
